

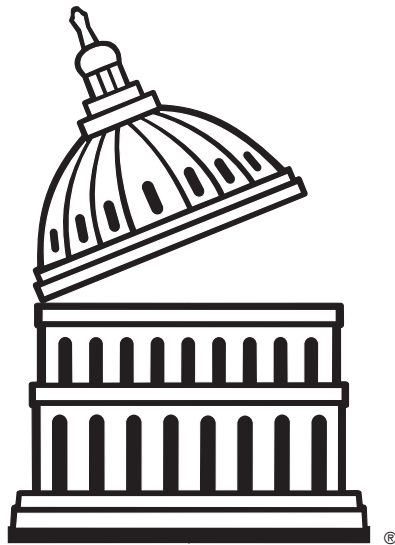

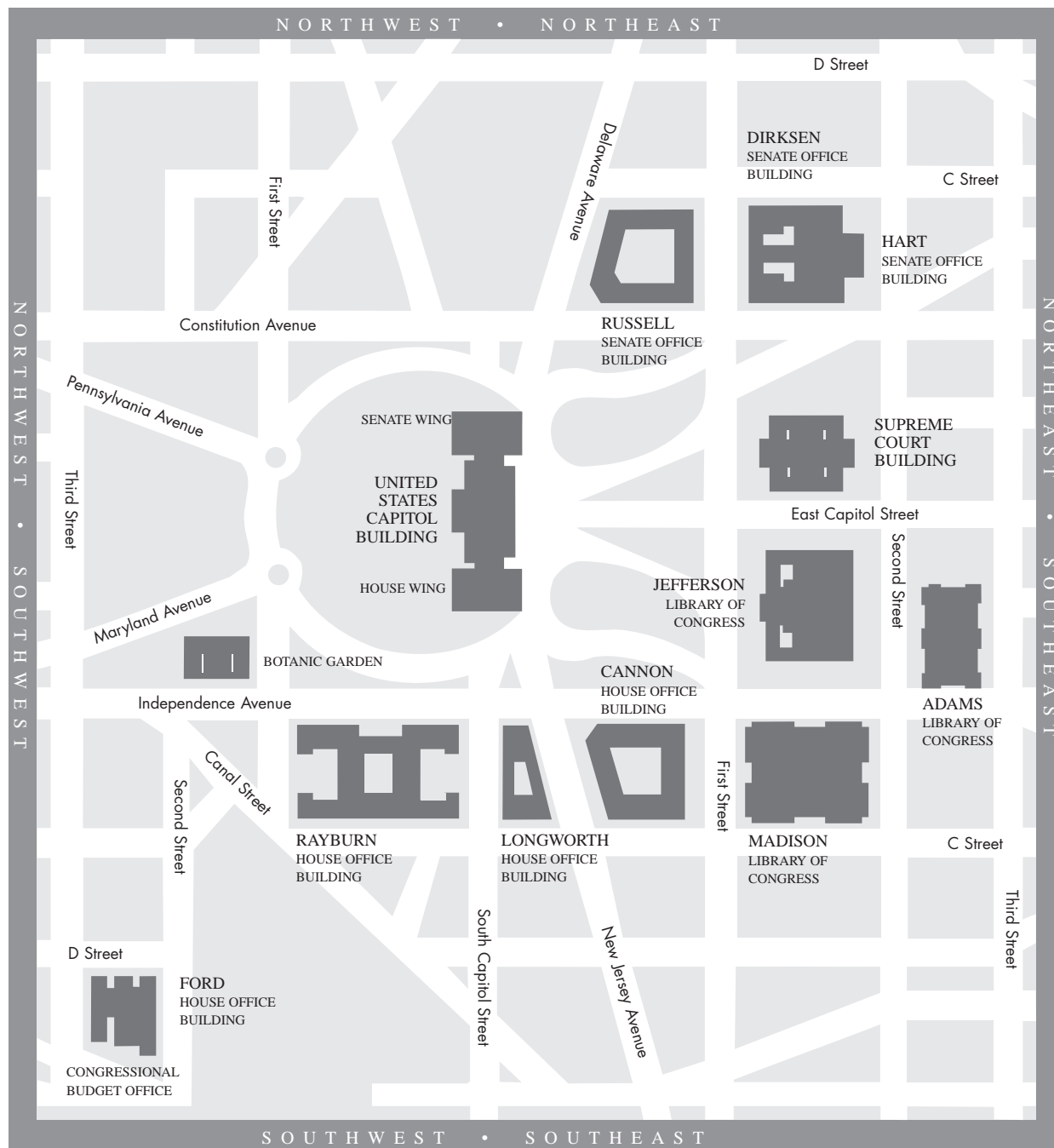

On January 19, 2010, Scott P. Brown (R-MA) won the special election to replace the late Senator Edward M. "Ted" Kennedy. Senator Brown was sworn in as the newest Member of the U.S. Senate on February 4, 2010.

Vacancy in Florida's 19th Congressional District

On January 3, 2010, Representative Robert Wexler (D-FL, 19th) resigned from the 111th Congress to become President of the Center for Middle East Peace and Economic Cooperation. On February 3, 2010, Edward Lynch (D) and Ted Deutch (R) won their parties respective primary elections and will compete in a special general election to fill the vacant seat on April 13, 2010. Until a new member is elected to represent the 19th Congressional District of Florida, the office will be run under the auspices of the Clerk of the House of Representatives. Vacancy in Hawaii's 1st Congressional District

On February 28, 2010, Representative Neil Abercrombie (D-HI, 1st) resigned from the 111th Congress to focus on his run for Governor of Hawaii. At press time, the special election to replace Representative Abercrombie had not been scheduled. Until a new Representative is elected to represent the 1st Congressional District of Hawaii, the office will be run under the auspices of the Clerk of the House of Representatives. Vacancy in Pennsylvania's 12th Congressional District

On February 8, 2010, Representative John P. Murtha (D-PA, 12th) died. Pennsylvania Governor Edward G. Rendell (D) announced that a special election to fill the unexpired term will be held on May 18, 2010. Until a new Representative is elected to represent the 12th Congressional District of Pennsylvania, the office will be run under the auspices of the Clerk of the House of Representatives. 1 Member's Name

The form of a Member's name (Joe, Dan) is listed in accordance with the preference of that Member.

2 Contact Information

Lists political party and state and district represented, office telephone number, fax number, TDD number (Telephone Device for the Deaf), E-mail and Internet Home Page address where provided by office. Office locations and mailing instructions are listed in the Building Code Table on page xiv.

3 Member's Photograph and Biographical Information

Profession: Refers to major area(s) of career concentration prior to election to current office.

4 Key Staff Aides

Lists Member's key staff aides, with address if he or she is not located at member's office, telephone number, e-mail, legislative responsibilities, and education.

5 Committee Assignments

Lists Member's committee and subcommittee memberships. Leadership positions within committees and subcommittees are listed in italics.

6 Leadership and Member Organizations

Lists leadership positions and membership in informal groups, many of which are included in the Leadership Section or Congressional Offices and Member Organizations Section.

7 State Offices/District Offices

Offices are listed in alphabetical order by city. Address and telephone and fax numbers are provided for each, along with the office's staff, staff telephone numbers, and e-mail.
